Dear all,

Belated Christmas and New Year wishes from Fr. Albert Irudayasamy. Robert Kelly in one of his books says that our God is God of surprises. That is very much true of my coming to St. Anne's parish. After being assigned as an associate pastor to St. Roch's parish, Oxford for a year, I got a phone call from Fr. Walter Riley, the personnel director of Worcester diocese, within a month asking me to go to St. Anne's parish, Southborough to be the sacramental minister. The phone call came just on the eve of Christmas and encouraged me to move with in a week and it was a surprise to get transfer within a month but I expressed my willingness to be part of your faith family and so moved to St. Anne's on 4th January 2016.

After sharing my surprise transfer, I shall introduce myself in short. I was born in India and was ordained in 1996. After my ordination, I had gone to Hong Kong to be a missionary for 13 years, learnt Chinese and enjoyed being part of the Chinese Church and culture. I came to USA in 2008 to do a masters at Boston College and completed my dual degrees both in Counseling Psychology and Pastoral ministry in 2011. I also had the opportunity to complete Post-masters certificate in Spiritual direction in 2012. After which, I had worked in one of the mental health clinics for three years to complete required clinical hours to be a certified mental health counselor. Plan to get LMHC (Licensed Mental Health Counselor) after appearing for exams.

During my clinical work at the clinic, I stayed in St. Roch's parish as a residence priest and rendered my service to our parishioners over there. Here I am at St. Anne at the beginning of the year 2016, expressing my willingness to work with Deacon Paul Reuter and other staff members in order to serve you all God's chosen people. May we utilize all our talents and gifts at the service of God and one another. Because Jesus said, "Son of Man came not to be served but to serve".

Bishop Robert McManus has asked me to be the campus minister at St. Bernard's High School, Fitchburg and so I will be working in the school two days a week (most probably on Wednesdays and Thursdays). I will be residing at our rectory most of the days and so don't hesitate to approach me. Let us work together for the well-being of our faith family and move forward with God's blessings. May this Year of Mercy help us to reconcile with God and with one another.

Reflections on today's Gospel: After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened." What a treat to be in that crowd! Just imagine the experience of witnessing this manifestation of divinity! To SEE the Holy Spirit "in bodily form like a dove" and to hear the voice that "came from heaven" announcing Jesus' true identity. Don't we all long for this kind of miraculous clarity? Wouldn't it do wonders for our faith if we had such unmistakable certainty about who Jesus really is?

It's easy to imagine that the first Christians had it easier than we do. They got to be with Jesus in person, and to witness the miracles that went along with his years on earth. Because of this, we can quickly forget the benefits we enjoy that they did not. We live on the other side of the Resurrection, for example. The first followers of Christ believed in him BEFORE he rose from the dead. We, on the other hand, have the confidence of knowing that this man literally conquered death. We also have two millennia of Christian witness through the saints to pull upon. The first Christians had no idea what this new religion would produce, how many people would embrace it, or how it would change the world for the better. We know that Christianity has been fruitful beyond measure.

Today's Gospel informs us that it was only after they were baptized that the people witnessed the opening of heaven. Even Jesus himself was baptized before he heard this earthly confirmation of his heavenly origin. We who have been baptized, following the example of Christ, also have "access" to the voice of God. In the silence of our hearts, and through God's word in the Bible (another advantage we enjoy), heaven is "opened" for us as well.
